


7.5 million "Doing nothing, going nowhere"

NEETS: Not employed, not in education, not in training

CDE's Approach

- 20 youth unemployment hot spots
- More than 60% of young unemployed
- Over 700 people
- 40 workshops/ discussions
- 8 provinces





Spatial legacies have not been dealt with Democratic SA

- No rural strategy
- Not thought hard enough about former homelands, forced removals, impact of grand apartheid
- No strategy to deal with rapid urban migration, expanding cities, urban spatial apartheid
- Local government discussed too often in isolation from national economic realities

One result: Millions of young people neglected, excluded from economic opportunity

 - Little capacity

Cities, towns and regions

Stop ignoring rural young people, smaller cities and towns

- Need to be connected to economic opportunity
- Focus on making young rural people more mobile, more informed
- Labour Centres?

Towns/cities with potential

- More business friendly municipalities
 - Growth coalition WB Competitive Cities
 - Red tape/zoning
- SEZs
- Most jobs will be in big cities and local growth dependent on national reforms





SA needs a strategy for rapid growth

- Return to growth prerequisite for faster employment growth
- Must prioritise growth & jobs New Deal?
- Growing economy makes all firms more viable
- Lots of new firms good for employment growth and transformation

Different conversation about growth, reform and jobs essential



Incentivise firms to employ people

- Workers must be protected, and South Africa's wage-setting machinery must be fair to all parties. But ways must be sought of achieving this without serving as a disincentive to create employment
- Encourage apprenticeships, internships, etc but across the board and sustainable
- Extend youth wage subsidy
- Review HLP recommendations for those with no connection to the labour market
- SA needs industries to employ low-skill people
 - Light manufacturing; EPZ Nelson Mandela Bay
 - Other industries

Stop encouraging firms to hire fewer people – reforms essential



Education counts

- Better basic education
- Better vocational education and training
- **BUT** this is not an employment strategy
- Think of all the people left behind
 - Progress through school system leaves many behind
 - Current NEETS



SA's employment strategy needs this and other priorities



- Faster growth, many more firms
- Millions more jobs
- Reduce costs of employment for young people
- Support urbanization
- Flood poor areas with improved schools and work relevant training
